Russia has the longest Arctic border at 22,600 kilometres, and hosts 43% of the Arctic region

More than 22% of all Russian exports, representing 11% of national income, originate in the Russian Federation's Arctic zone



The Northern Sea Route is the most important route for Russian and international shipping in the Arctic. More than 5 million tonnes of cargo are delivered via this route annually

More than 700 oil and gas fields, as well as non-ferrous and precious metal deposits, including over 350 gold deposits, are located in Arctic territory
